### **Center for Career Development & Experiential Learning**

The Center for Career Development & Experiential Learning hosted information sessions with the **Glaelle Mathurin Tech Program, Bank of America, Macmillian, Shivoo**, and **Deloitte**. These sessions were very informative, and students learned about current internship and/or job opportunities currently available to them.

The Center also partnered with KCC's Transfer Manager, Juliana Dorcelus, to facilitate an Entrepreneurship panel. Students learned about what it takes to get into and succeed in the field and the transfer options available if they decide to pursue entrepreneurship as a career path. Guest speakers included KCC Alum, Lavar Thomas (Motivational Speaker & Career Coach), Amy Miller, Adia Johnson (CUNY Startups), and James Lynch, Associate Professor at Brooklyn College.

A successful **Service Fair**, in partnership with Student Life, brought community partners together to promote opportunities for students. #### **Grant Proposals**

The division submitted two proposals to the **CUNY Future of Work** grant program. The program aims to develop, test, and scale strategies that move students in non-credit workforce and continuing education programs to career opportunities and/or degree programs. We proposed two programs: **Maternal Health & Doula** and **Welding**. If funded, we will work with faculty to revise the curriculum and develop articulation agreements to move non-credit students to degree programs at the college.

The **CUNY Fatherhood Academy** was invited to submit a proposal to the <u>Good+ Foundation</u>, a local nonprofit whose mission is to dismantle multi-generational poverty by donating tangible goods to under-resourced parents and caregivers. If awarded, Good+ will donate childcare goods (strollers, cribs, diapers, books, etc.) to CFA fathers. Due to funding constraints, the program does not provide these items to students; therefore, a partnership with Good+ would be immensely helpful.

On April 1, the <u>Maternal Health and Doula Training</u> ended by certifying 47 students who successfully completed the program and earned their CUNY Certificate of Completion in Maternal Health, DONA Introduction to Childbirth for Doulas, DONA Lactation Support Education and DONA International Birth Doula Training. The next training begins on July 1. Applicants can <u>register here</u>.

## ESL/HSE/SNAP Venture & CLIP Program

During April, students in the Winter/Spring 2024 semester of the Strides to Continuing Success ESL/Food Handlers Certificate Training Program completed the second phase of their credential testing: 14 of the 16 eligible candidates passed the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene Food Protection exam, and additional program participants are scheduled to test in the near future.

The Kingsborough English Language Institute's intensive full-time academic ESL-70 program recently commenced its Spring semester, along with the High School Equivalency HSE-70 and the Alternative HSE Preparation (AHSEP) program, Diploma Now. This full-time HSE preparation program focuses on core content areas, such as math, science, social studies, and ELA, and is developed for out-of-school youth aged 17 1/2 and 20. Diploma Now provides an alternative pathway to attaining the high school diploma.
