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Highlights – Metrics on which KCC Exceeded the CUNY Community College Average

- Percent of instruction delivered by full-time faculty (increased and is the highest of all CUNY colleges)

- Total voluntary support increased from \$2,248,840 in 2018-2019 to \$3,037,728 in 2019-2020 (three year rolling average)

Executive Summary

Kingsborough Community College remains committed to examining its strengths and weaknesses and striving to improve continuously. The outcome metrics for the 2019-2020 year confirm that Kingsborough continues to be a leader in student retention, credit accumulation, and graduation. KCC achieved the second highest fall-to-fall retention rate (65.7%) of any CUNY community college, and our freshmen have the second highest rate of earning 20 (50.1%) or 30 (20.9%) credits in their initial year of CUNY CCs. KCC's three-year graduation rate increased to 34.3%, second only to Guttman CC. The ASAP graduation rate (51.6%) is also the highest among CUNY colleges that offer Associate degrees.

Over the past decade or so, KCC has emphasized improving student outcomes in English, and has long required all students to register for the appropriate English course during their first semester. However, the percentage of freshmen who completed gateway English during their first year has dropped to 63.2% (from 67.2% in 2018-2019), and no longer exceeds the community college average.

As a corollary to its emphasis on English as well as major requirements, KCC has in the past anticipated that students not in STEM majors would not take Math immediately; rather they would register for it later in their college careers. As a result, only 21.2% of Fall 2014 freshmen completed a gateway Math course in their first year. Since 2014, we have increased our emphasis on encouraging students to register for Math courses as early as possible, and have developed additional early interventions in Math. Consequently, the rate of Fall 2018 freshmen completing gateway Math in their first year increased to 30.8% (down from 31.7% in 2017). We recognize that this remains well below the community college average, and we are continuing to ramp up our efforts to facilitate progress in Math. To this end, we are scaling up co-requisite courses in developmental and credit-bearing Math, have created new pre-matriculation interventions, and have increased student support by expanding and improving tutoring services.

The statistics show that KCC faces additional challenges. While the College has made a big push to identify and address gaps in equity, it still has a considerable distance to go in diversifying its workforce and reaching all segments of the potential student population. Although it has increased steadily since Fall 2014, the percentage of faculty who are under-represented minorities (30.2%) is the lowest of any CUNY community college. The increases, while consistent, have been modest, and the College needs to redouble its efforts to recruit URM faculty and create an environment where they can thrive.

Kingsborough lags behind in student diversity as well. Although the student body generally is representative of the racial and ethnic demographics of Brooklyn, the percentage of Hispanic students lags well behind the other community colleges. The College has begun to reach out more aggressively into the diverse neighborhoods in our borough, and will increase these efforts in the coming year.

Another area of potential improvement is that KCC students tend to be of traditional college age, and enrollment of students aged 25 and older (21.5%) is below the community college average. In developing programs to meet the needs of adult students, the College is creating additional options such as KCC Flex.

KCC would also like to raise the percentage of students majoring in STEM disciplines (16.0%), which is below the community college average (18.4%). However, we recognize that in order to do this we need

to continue to develop new degree programs that meet the changing needs of the borough and its workforce.
