Admissions Requirements to Senior College Program

Graduates must have completed an A.S. degree. Pursuant to University policy, students who have earned a City University Associate in Science (A.S.) degree will be deemed to have automatically fulfilled the lower division liberal arts and science distribution requirements for a baccalaureate degree (according to Pathways and other Brooklyn College requirements). Students may be asked to take additional courses which are required by the major department.

For admission to the Department of Childhood, Bilingual and Special Education Teacher (CBSE), transfer students must have achieved a minimum overall GPA of 2.7.

For admission to the CBSE department, graduates must demonstrate proficiency in 2 required English courses as stated in the Brooklyn College Bulletin. For admission to the CBSE department, graduates must have up-to-date immunizations.

Other Information

In addition to fulfilling the CUNY Pathways requirements, students must complete a liberal arts and science concentration (30 credits). Specific requirements apply for each concentration. Students should consult separate listings for the appropriate departments and meet with an adviser in the CBSE department.

All students in the CBSE department will be required to enroll with TK20.

In some instances, EDC 9105 taken with EDC 3000 may be used in lieu of EDC 90A4.

This agreement can be modified with the mutual approval of the two institutions.
