# **Center for Career Development & Experiential Learning**

The Center for Career Development hosted workshops on internships, public speaking, and LinkedIn with Shivoo, Menorah Nursing Home, and Glaelle Mathurin, which served 57 students.

Juliana Dorcelus, Transfer Manager, facilitated a second Career Pathways through Education panel focusing on the social services field. Students learned about various options available in the field if they pursue that career path. Guest speakers included KCC alum Philipe Turenne, Program Director Dr. Lakeia Murray, and Hunter Admissions representative Irina Amanatidis.

The Media Arts Department hosted a panel on Women in Media. Students learned about various employment opportunities from experts in the field. The panel was facilitated by Tema Staig, Executive Director of Women in Media, and included Jennifer Smith (Music Supervisor), Sinead Clancy (Production Designer), Rachael Hastings (Cinematographer/Director of Photography), NAOE (Cinematographer/Director of Photography). Many thanks to Professor John Acosta for the partnership on this event.

Eighteen (18) students participated in **Junior Achievement's Teach for a Day** and worked with 5th-grade students (6 classes) to teach lessons at a local elementary school. The topic for this year was **JA Our Nation**. The lessons entailed concepts regarding starting a business, career planning, skills needed for a successful career, and how businesses connect to a global economy. Students networked with their peers and improved their public speaking and communication skills as a part of this service project. ### **Grant Awards/Proposals**

The Division was **awarded a \$177,000 grant** for the *CUNY Future of Work Center* to support expanding our workforce-eligible programs, including creating a **Welding TAP for Workforce Microcredential Pathway**. This funding will include the development of a noncredit-to-credit articulation agreement with the **Maritime Technology** program and support three student cohorts. The pathway will combine two existing credit courses, MT5200 - Welding and MT5800 - Advanced Welding, with the American Welding Society (AWS).

In collaboration with the Office of Collaborative Programs and partnership with NYC Health + Hospitals/South Brooklyn Health and Brooklyn's Community of Care, the Division submitted a 6-year, \$4.1M proposal to the Department of Youth and Community Development's (DYCD) Train & Earn program. If awarded, Kingsborough will train out-of-school, out-of-work (OSOW) young adults (18-24) in three high-growth healthcare industry jobs: Central Sterile Technician, Emergency Medical Technician, and Medical Billing & Coding. Students will be supported by a team of case managers, a mental health professional, and a large suite of supportive services to ensure they succeed in the classroom and on the job.

The Division submitted a \$60K proposal to the Con Edison Foundation to support the creation of the KCC-ConEd Clean Energy Academy. The Academy aims to provide career exploration in Weatherization Technician training. We will target NYC residents who live in environmental justice and disadvantaged communities, specifically people who might not have considered careers in clean energy. This program adds to our growing portfolio of clean energy and offshore wind training and shows our commitment to expanding the NYC clean energy and sustainable workforce.

#### **Workforce Trainings**

Kymel Yard, Director of KCC's CUNY Fatherhood Academy (CFA), was invited to Aspen Institute's Opportunity Youth Forum (OYF) for a second year to represent YES Bed Stuy

and the program. The OYF convenes its network of national, state, and local community partners, youth leaders, organizers, philanthropic partners, technical assistance partners, and artists to align on their collective vision and deepen their commitment and shared mission for expanding justice, advancing racial equity, narrative change, healing, belonging, meaning, well-being, purpose (BMWP) and protecting our democracy and ensuring it works for all.

The CUNY Fatherhood Academy was invited to apply to become a Good Plus Foundation partner, and our application was approved. Good Plus Foundation is a leading national non-profit that works to dismantle multi-generational poverty by pairing tangible goods with innovative services for under-resourced fathers, mothers, and caregivers, creating an upward trajectory for the whole family. Partnering with Good Plus will make resources such as cribs, strollers, and other necessities available to fathers enrolled in the program and, by extension, their families. Good Plus believes that stronger fathers build stronger, more resilient families, which are the backbone of thriving communities and found that 93 percent of fathers receiving donations found that their relationship with their children improved, while 82 percent of fathers reported improved relationships with their children's mother and/or other relatives.

The summer CompTIA ITF+ course will begin on June 3, 2024, and we are currently accepting applications for the Fall A+ and Network+ courses (<u>Apply Here</u>). Our recent Network+ course ended on April 24, 2024, and the A+ course will end on June 6, 2024. Spring 2024 students participated in professional development workshops led by Roberto Dockery, Vice President of Security Operations at Morgan Stanley, and Craig Russon, Senior Academic Consultant at CompTIA.

**Do you know someone who wants to be a helping professional?** Do they want to help individuals reach their goals and achieve milestones? Or help individuals and families live more fun and fulfilling lives? Tell them about the **Community Habilitation/Direct Support Professional training program** starting July 8 and running for 6 weeks on Mondays-Thursdays from 6:00-9:00pm live online via Zoom. Students will earn CPR, Mandated Reporter, Choking Prevention Certifications, and a CUNY Certificate of Completion. (CPR Class will occur on campus on 8/15 from 10:00am-6:00pm). #### **Staff Presentations and Recognitions**

On May 8th, Robert Zandi, KCC's Associate Director of Renewal Energy Programs, presented at NYC Economic Development Corporations (NYCEDC)

New York Offshore Wind Academic Symposium. KCC presented its Maritime and Offshore Wind Energy related training, programs and, apprenticeships, as well as the CUNY Offshore Wind Advisory Network (OWAN), a consortium with LaGuardia Community College, College of Staten Island, City Tech and, KCC, in which KCC is the lead. Each school provides the OWAN's Bridges to Offshore Wind workshop to environmental justice and disadvantaged communities to educate and empower participants on the science, history, jobs, and future of this industry, as well as the wide variety of training and programs related to Offshore Wind Energy. The event was a huge success and generated tremendous interest from the Department of Labor, various Community-Based Organizations, environmental justice organizations, NYCEDC, NYSERDA, other schools in NY, and a variety of Offshore Wind Energy developers, which has the potential to lead to further support of KCC's programs, as well as develop additional partnerships to expand the KCC's offerings.

KCC was part of the NYSERDA Offshore Wind Environmental Justice Technical Working Group (EJTWG) to meet with Offshore Wind developers, Local 1-2 Union, Community-Based Organizations, Environmental Justice Organizations, community leaders, and community members at the Ravenswood Power Plant to discuss ensuring a transition from fossil fuel power generation to the future of clean and renewable energy that directly benefits environmental justice and disadvantaged communities. The NYSERDA EJTWG plays a vital role in ensuring a just transition by helping to inform and shape development practices through data sharing, collaboration, advice, and guidance from the community to help steer NY's efforts. Ravenswood Power Plant was an excellent site for this meeting because it is working on decommissioning its traditional fossil fuel power-generated power plant and is becoming a 100% renewable energy power station.
