Dear Campus Community,

Please find below some updates and highlights regarding our work within the division for March 2025.

## **Grant Proposals and Awards**

We were **awarded a \$600,000 grant from CUNY** for a **contextualized healthcare training** program. Building off of our 2024 CUNY English Language for Work training program, this new program will prepare students for careers as **Home Health Aides** and **Direct Support Professionals**. With more older adults and people with disabilities choosing homebased care, there is a growing demand for these healthcare workers in NYC.

The Education Design Lab (EDL) awarded the division a \$50,000 grant to develop an ITfocused micro pathway. Since 2020, EDL has awarded over \$100K to create 3 micro pathway programs: Health Coach, User Experience Design, and Customer Service. We are thankful for EDL's continued support and are excited to begin another project.

The division submitted a \$50,000 proposal for new welding equipment and supplies to the American Welding Society's Workforce Training Grant program. In 2023, we worked with the Maritime Technology department to develop a welding workforce training program. Since then, we have launched 3 cohorts, serving 50 students. If awarded, the funds will allow us to purchase supplies and replace old welding equipment damaged during Superstorm Sandy.

### **Center for Career Development & Experiential Learning**

The Center hosted two volunteer workshops: Time Management and Internship Orientation serving 35 students. In addition, we visited over 20 classes to introduce the center's services to students. # **Community Farm & Garden**

**NEW COURSE:** Learn How to Grow Plants Using Hydroponics Through Hands-On Experience. The course will cover essential hydroponic skills, including building, maintaining, and troubleshooting systems, as well as essential plant health, propagation, and harvesting. Students will be introduced to various hydroponic growing systems and the hydroponic industry and provided with skills to enter the workforce. Students who complete the program will earn

the <u>Kingsborough Hydroponics Workforce Training</u> micro credential (digital badge). No experience necessary to take the course.

The **Community Farm and Garden** is open and **volunteer days/hours:** Mondays 2:00-5:00pm, Tuesdays 2:00-5:00pm, Wednesdays 9:00-11:00am, Thursdays 9:00-11:00am and 2:00-5:00pm, and Fridays 2:00-5:00pm. **Vegetable distribution** will resume in April/May, weather permitting. **18 work-study students** are working on the farm this spring, and we look forward to welcoming more this summer.

#### **Workforce Trainings**

The division facilitated another globally recognized American Hotel and Lodging Educational Institution (AHLEI) certification program in collaboration with CAMBA. The program consists of 48 hours of learning: NYSED WIOA-IELCE Hospitality & Tourism in Golden Opportunities (4 hours), Making Connections (4 hours), and Certified Restaurant Server (40 hours). It trained 60 students in three cohorts.

From Cannabis to Cuisine started its final cohort on March 6th, enrolling nearly 300 students throughout the 2-year program. Since January 2025, the career counselor has placed alumni with industry partner, The Travel Agency, for retail and inventory positions, set to open in April. In addition, all current students will be able to celebrate their program completion in June 2025 with celebrity Chef Miguel Trinidad, owner of multiple Michelin-rated restaurants, including Marie's in Bushwick. The Culinary Cannabis team is also partnering with Cannabis NYC to host an on-campus event on June 11th for their Lift Off tour; stay tuned!

We partnered with the Maritime Technology program and launched a new pathway into the Welding program with 15 students. This free 15-week training is utilizing the American Welding Society Fundamentals. As a result, students will learn stick (SMAW), MIG (GMAW), and TIG (TMAW) welding techniques, which will prepare them to take and pass the American Welding Society's 3G Welders Certification and provide them with college credits upon completion of the program. The division tabled at the Brooklyn Navy Yard Labor Union & Apprenticeship Career Fair on March 19<sup>th</sup> to promote the KCC & Seafarers International Union Pre-Apprenticeship, the KCC Maritime Technician Apprenticeship, and other Renewable Energy and Sustainable Technology programs. Applications are open for the Clinical Medical Assistant and Central Sterile Processing Technician Scholarships, which are funded by the Cabrini Foundation. Selections will be made

**CUNY Fatherhood Academy** completed its 10th cohort with 5 students on March 13<sup>th</sup> and started the 19<sup>th</sup> HSE cohort with 14 students enrolled in Bootcamp and 12 actively attending. We also completed the first Alumni Encore group and will continue working with the testing office to increase student test-taking outcomes. The Winter 2025 Maternal Health and DONA Doula training concluded on March 10th. 20 students completed and received DONA certifications, which allow them to continue their educational and career goals towards becoming a doula. Doula students from this cohort and previous cohorts were also allowed to participate in additional training, including how to become a Medicaid provider and additional childbirth doula training offered by community partners. The Doula program assistant, Denise Jacobs, organized and made these opportunities available to students. The next cohort is scheduled to begin on May 7th. **NEW COURSE**: The first **Postpartum Doula** training **starts July 7th**. Applicants can <u>sign up</u> for the interest list here, and when registration opens up, they will receive the link to apply. This **21-hour training is the first at Kingsborough and CUNY**. It will prepare students to **support families** as they navigate the **early stages of parenthood**, ensuring they feel **informed**, **supported**, **and confident** in their new roles.

Thirty (30) students completed the Direct Support Professional/Community Habilitation (DSP/Com Hab) training on March 6. They learned about the history of disability services in NYS, core competencies, and the code of ethics for DSPs. Topics included: abuse prevention, incident reporting, people-first language, and other necessary information for becoming an effective DSP/Com Hab professional. Students met with employer partners upon completing training and were provided opportunities to apply for field jobs.

Nineteen (19) students completed the Community Health Worker training in partnership with NYU Langone. Students participated in four courses: Critical Issues in Community Health, Community Health Worker/CPR, Concepts of Wellness and Community Health Interventions, taught by the Community Health faculty. Students will receive employment readiness support and job placement assistance from NYU and are eligible to apply to Kingsborough and enter the Community Health degree program with up to 12 college credits.

Cypress Hills Satellite offered a beginner ESL class to 20 students, and enrollment will continue to increase as student interest grows. For more information, please email Angela King at angela.king@kbcc.cuny.edu.

**Twenty-four (24)** - almost 100 percent of the winter 2025 **ESL/Food Handlers Certificate Training Program** cohort – achieved the National Restaurant Association's ServSafe credential in March 2025.
