Change in Degree Requirements

A.S. in Community Health

SUBMITTED September 19, 2014

The following information is submitted as pertinent to explain and illustrate the proposed change to our curriculum.

- 1) Department: Health, Physical Education & Recreation, Courses: <u>Field Experience in Community</u> Health (COH 91E1) (3 credits)
- 2) The Community Health major currently has a requirement in which students have to successfully complete a computer course: Introduction to Computer Concepts (BA 6000), Office Computer Applications (TEC 2500), or Introduction to Computers and Computer Applications (CP 1100). Because of the high likelihood that students develop basic computer skills through their current courses (especially hybrid and Blackboard-enhanced courses), these computer courses are not considered as necessary for professional development as before. In order to stay current with changes in the public health job market and academic programs, we propose replacing the computer course with Field Experience in Community Health (COH 91E1). Many potential employers and academic programs want to recruit students that already have some practical experience with providing basic community and public health services in communities affected by health disparities. COH 91E1 is a course that fulfills this need as well as the Civic Engagement requirement at Kingsborough. The course is currently a requirement for one Community Health concentration (i.e., Health Education and Promotion). We would like to offer it as a requirement for completing the AS degree in Community Health for all concentrations in order to better serve our students' academic and professional needs.

In addition, to make up for the 3 credits removed from the concentration in Health Education and Promotion, students will be required to take 3 courses, instead of 2, among the following choices: Women's Health Issues (HE 3800), Drugs: The Individual and Society (HE 4000), Nutrition and Health (HE 4200), Human Sexuality (HE 5200), Men's Health Issues (HE 5400).

- 3) Currently, this course, when completed as part of the AS degree in Community Health, transfers as an elective to York College (CUNY), Lehman College (CUNY), Brooklyn College (CUNY), and Hunter College (CUNY), as well as colleges outside of CUNY.
- 4) Bulletin description (per the 2014-2015 College Catalog) shows each course description as the following:

COH 91E1 – FIELD EXPERIENCE IN COMMUNITY HEALTH (3 crs. 1 class hour plus 100 field hours) Under Agency and Department supervision working in the

field (100 hours are required), students broaden knowledge and deepen understanding of current Community Health issues. They work on Community Health problems, meet experienced professionals, familiarize themselves with the practices and methods used to ensure and protect the community and experience the "real life" challenges of the Community Health professional.

Prerequisites: COH 1100, COH 1200, and COH 2000

Pre/Co-requisite: COH 1300

<u>CURRENT</u>: Our curriculum sheet and the degree requirements outlined in the most current college catalog (p. 59) state that students must take *Introduction to Computer Concepts (BA 6000), Office Computer Applications (TEC 2500), or Introduction to Computers and Computer Applications (CP 1100) as part of the requirements for the AS Degree in Community Health (across all concentrations). (See CURRENT curriculum sheet and college catalog page.)*

Students in the Health Education and Promotion concentration are required to take 2 courses among the following choices: Women's Health Issues (HE 3800), Drugs: The Individual and Society (HE 4000), Nutrition and Health (HE 4200), Human Sexuality (HE 5200), Men's Health Issues (HE 5400).

<u>PROPOSED</u>: To keep our course offerings in line with demands of the industry, we <u>propose</u> the following change to the degree requirements: all students, regardless of concentration, must take <u>Field Experience in Community Health (COH 91E1)</u> as part of the requirements for the AS Degree in Community. (See PROPOSED curriculum sheet.)

Students in the Health Education and Promotion concentration will be required to take 3 courses among the following choices: Women's Health Issues (HE 3800), Drugs: The Individual and Society (HE 4000), Nutrition and Health (HE 4200), Human Sexuality (HE 5200), Men's Health Issues (HE 5400).

We propose the above changes to the degree requirements in order to facilitate registration and better preparation for Community Health students.
