RE: Change in Course Description for THA 4100 – Production Practicum

The Department of Communications & Performing Arts is proposing a change in Course Description for THA 4100 – Production Practicum:

FROM:

Practical experience working on theatre productions. Students are assigned to work on scenic construction, lighting, costumes, and other production tasks. This course may be repeated three times for a total of three (3) credits.

TO:

This practice-based course provides students with hands-on experience working onstage and backstage for live theatrical productions. Working within an ensemble of student and faculty theatre artists, students will practice and execute the theatre skills associated with acting, design, technical theatre, and stage management. This course may be repeated three times for a total of three (3) credits.

Rationale for Change:

The change in course description more accurately reflects course content and more clearly articulates the learning goals and student experience associated with his course.
