


#### J. Full- or Part-Time Status







Does the student speak another language at home? (Degree students only)





Fall 2010 Enrollment of Men and Women







Percent of Fall 2010 Freshmen Passing





Percent of Fall 2011 Freshmen Passing








# Credit Students Enrollment Headcount Fall 2006 to Fall 2010






# Degrees and Certificates Awarded By Ethnicity 2005-2006 to 2009-2010

# Comparative Distributions of Graduates and Enrollees By Ethnicity 2009-2010





Continuing Education Annual Enrollments By Age Fall 2010 - Summer 2011


2010 - 2011 ACE Enrollments Age Distribution

Continuing Education Annual Enrollments By Gender Fall 2010 - Summer 2011


2010 - 2011 ACE Enrollments Gender Distribution








