A Kingsborough Community College alumna and a first-generation college graduate, Tara Yarczower '97 has a firsthand appreciation for the student experience and all of the challenges that come with it. This appreciation goes all the way back to her days as an undergraduate, when she also worked as a student aide: "being a KCC student *and* a KCC employee at the same time allowed me to appreciate both sides of college life—the day-to-day of being a student and the 'behind-the-scenes' work of administration."

Later, Ms. Yarczower worked in Freshman Services—which gave her an even broader understanding of the student experience—before finally gravitating to her current role as KCC's Director of Military and Veteran Affairs.

When veterans come home from tours of duty, they often trade the clear-cut structure of the military for the grey areas and uncertainties of civilian life. At KCC, these brave men and women have a champion in Ms. Yarczower, whose gratitude for veterans hits very close to home: "Growing up, I had a lot of military members on both sides of my family. I understand what the sacrifice means, and what's at stake."

Ms. Yarczower is keenly aware of the obstacles that veterans face, from navigating the road to graduation to readjusting to post-military life. But her service to KCC students does not begin at 9am or end at 5pm—nor is it limited to just helping veterans. As a donor to the KCC Foundation, Ms. Yarczower goes the extra mile every year by supporting student scholarships and the college as a whole. Last year, she was named an inaugural member of the *Anchor Club*, which recognizes KCC's most loyal and consistent donors. "Giving back to KCC each year has always made sense.
