Please find below some updates and highlights regarding our work within the division for November 2025.

Center for Career Development & Experiential Learning

The Center for Career Development & Experiential Learning is excited to announce that 11 students participated in CUNY Career Discovery Week, hosted by the New York Jobs CEO Council. This week-long series allowed second-year students to connect directly with leading employers across industries in finance, technology, healthcare, professional services, real estate, insurance, energy & utilities, and law. Students learned which skills are most valued and better understood how to succeed in recruitment pipelines. Employers our students connected with were Mount Sinai Hospital, Wells Fargo, Union Square Hospitality Group, IMB, Memorial Sloan Kettering, New York-Presbyterian, Bank of America, Barclays, and Zurich.

At the end of October, the Center for Career Development & Experiential Learning hosted Deloitte staff who facilitated a hybrid Accounting 1.0 workshop for students interested in business and accounting careers. Thirty-three (33) students attended and were guided through a reflection of who they are today and who they aspire to be in 10 years. In addition, they were exposed to a wide range of career options. We look forward to our continued partnership with Deloitte.

The Center hosted several information sessions with the Brooklyn Queens Long Island Area Health Education Center (BQLI AHEC) for students in health-related majors. Students were introduced to BQLI AHEC's program, which prepares students to serve in medically underserved communities and provides hands-on experiential learning in community-based healthcare settings. The Center also hosted an information session with the Brooklyn Navy Yard (BNY) to provide details about BNY's paid spring internship, so they are better prepared for the application process. Workshops included *How to Ace the Interview* and *So, You Want to Be a Chef*, an interactive session that exposed students to the realities of the culinary field.

Career Pathways in Education Panel in collaboration with the Transfer Manager, Juliana Dorcelus, which focused on Youth Studies. Panelists consisted of Colleen Mims (KCC Alumnus – Special Education Teacher), Samantha Jean-Baptiste (Licensed Social Worker - ACS), Sommer Goodman (KCC Alumnus – Speech & Language Pathologist), Professor Barnabas Crosby (KCC Faculty - Education Program), and Madeline Fox (Associate Professor of Children & Youth Studies at Brooklyn College). Seventeen (17) students participated in this session, which provided valuable insights and exposed them to a variety of potential career paths in the field.

Workforce Trainings

The New York University Community Health Worker Upskilling training successfully concluded. Students received 100 hours of instruction, which they can apply to their current roles in the field. With Professor Yolanda Blue's guidance, students learned about the role and scope of practice, major, life-threatening chronic diseases, and behavioral health disorders that impact population health, and strategies to improve outcomes. They also learned about practice-specific engagement tools and how to navigate health care and social service systems. As a result of the training, students became effective advocates for patients who lack access to healthcare providers and support services and gained the skills to reach their communities through facilitating focus groups, presentations, and workshops.

Fall 2025 Maternal Health and DONA Doula training concluded with 34 students. Participants earned their CUNY Certificate of Completion and the DONA Birth Doula Certificate of Completion, which comprises Lactation and Childbirth Education training. Students will work with Denise Jacobs to connect with community doula resources, including Caribbean Women's Health Association, the Brooklyn Perinatal Network, and the Citywide Doula Initiative, to explore opportunities to work with birthing families and gain further experience in the field.

In partnership with the NYC Department of Youth and Community Development, we offered Certified Medical Administrative Assistant, Pharmacy Technician Intensive, and Graphic Design programs for youth and young adults. A total of 78 students are currently enrolled, and classes will be completed at the end of December.
