- 1. Demonstrate knowledge of literary tropes, genres, periods, and terminology, applying a variety of critical lenses to literary works through close reading
- 2. Express ideas cogently, persuasively, and in conformity with the conventions and citation styles of the discipline orally and in writing
- 3. Conduct research using resources, such as library collections, databases, and archives, to utilize primary and secondary sources in support of arguments
