RE: Change in Course Description for TAH 9096 - The Virtual Enterprise

The Department of Tourism and Hospitality is proposing a change in Course Description TAH 9096 - The Virtual Enterprise.

FROM:

Introduction to business operations of tourism, hospitality, aviation, international transportation, and the food service industries through the development operation of a simulated business environment. Utilizing technology, students trade products and services, and form decision-making teams that conceive, organize and operate business transactions.

TO:

This course immerses students in the dynamic world of tourism and hospitality, focusing on innovation and business-building. Students will conceptualize, develop, and pitch an innovative business venture within the tourism and hospitality industry. Through a practical teaching environment, students gain the foundational skills needed to launch a successful enterprise within the industry.

Rationale for Change:

The current course description is outdated and poses challenges for transfer. The updated description addresses transfer equivalency challenges. Additionally, the new description gives students a better understanding of the course. There is no change to the course curriculum.
